INTRODUCTION:

I made the following statement last week: "All of God's wrath against sin was poured out upon Christ on the cross. Not part of it—all of it." I want to qualify that statement in light of today's message. When I made that statement, I was talking about those who have put their faith in the Lord's Jesus Christ for salvation. When we repent and come to faith in Christ's death and resurrection there is no longer any wrath of God reserved for us because we have been declared righteous in the Lord Jesus.

With that said, there is a future day of judgment for those who refuse to repent and receive the free gift of salvation offered through the death and resurrection of the Lord's Jesus. Paul speaks of this future judgment to encourage the Thessalonian believers as they endured intense persecution and afflictions. Paul encourages them to continue to persevere and to be steadfast in hope of a coming rest.
