# <u>CHRISTIAN CONDUCT – PART 4 – CONCERNING THE SPIRIT</u> <u>AND THE WORD</u> --1<sup>st</sup> THESSALONIANS 5:19-22--

### **INTRODUCTION:**

Over the past several weeks we have been looking at Paul's concluding section in which he has been exhorting the Thessalonians on matters of Christian conduct. How they are to conduct themselves and the responsibilities they have in the different relationships that they have in the community of the church. Paul has discussed the relationship and responsibilities between the leaders and the congregation of the church. He has looked at the relationship between the members of the church, specifically what were the responsibilities towards those struggling in the church. Paul then exhorted the Thessalonians concerning their relationship with the Chief Shepherd, the Lord Jesus Christ. This morning we will look at Paul's final exhortations to the church, after that he will pray for the church and make his concluding remarks and his salutation. Paul's exhortations that we will look at this morning concern the Holy Spirit and God's Word.

- I. <u>DO NOT QUENCH THE SPIRIT</u> (1<sup>st</sup> Thessalonians 5:19)
  - a. Some teach that in verse nineteen Paul was warning the Thessalonian believers not to \_\_\_\_\_\_ the use of the gifts of prophecy and the gift of tongues in their church services.
  - b. I do not believe these arguments are \_\_\_\_\_ for two reasons.
    - i. First, there is nothing in these verses to show that they are any \_\_\_\_\_\_ than his earlier exhortations.
    - ii. Second, if the Thessalonian church had been stifling the miraculous gifts, Paul would have strongly them. (1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 12-14)
  - c. To truly understand and grasp this exhortation's true application you must remember the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers.

- d. It is the process of progressive \_\_\_\_\_ by the Holy Spirit that Paul exhorted the Thessalonians not to quench.

  - v. Fifth, the inward, supernatural \_\_\_\_\_\_ that helps us stay on the path of sanctification is from the Holy Spirit. (Ephesians 3:16)
  - g. Do not \_\_\_\_\_\_ the Holy Spirit as He seeks to sanctify you and bring you into conformity with the image of the Lord Jesus Christ.

### II. <u>DO NOT DESPISE THE WORD OF GOD</u> (1<sup>st</sup> Thess. 5:20)

- a. No words of man are \_\_\_\_\_\_ to the Word of God, God's Word is infinitely superior. (Deuteronomy 8:3; Matthew 4:4)
- b. The apostles and their companions received, spoke, and the text of the New Testament. (Acts 11:27-30;  $1^{st}$ Corinthians 14:3)
- c. In contrast to those who may have despised prophetic utterances, Paul's \_\_\_\_\_\_ for the Word of God was rooted in His love for God and for His Word. (Deuteronomy 6:6-9)
