THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY Zechariah 9:9-10

INTRODUCTION:

This morning we are going to focus on the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem. Today is Palm Sunday the day in which we remember this historic ride that Jesus took mounted on a donkey.

The Gospels of Matthew and John in their narrative of this event both quote from an Old Testament prophet a prophecy concerning this event. I want to look at that prophecy this morning and what it teaches us about this event. The two verses that we will look at speak of two different events as though they were one, one has been fulfilled and one is yet to be fulfilled, we will also learn that Scripture speaks of two triumphal entries and we will look at both today.

How do I know this? Both Zechariah 14 and Revelation 19 tell of my return with Him. The end of Zechariah 14:5 says, "Then the LORD, my God, will come, and all the holy ones with Him!" (Zechariah 14:5b, NASB95) I am one of His holy ones because I have been justified, declared righteous by God through faith in Jesus Christ. Revelation 19:14 says, "And the armies which are in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, were following Him on white horses." (Revelation 19:14, NASB95) Those who have put their faith in Jesus Christ are His holy ones, are part of His armies that will come with Him when He comes. We will rejoice greatly with shouts of triumph as He enters triumphantly into Jerusalem to set up His kingdom over all the earth. You can know that you will be there too if you have placed your faith in Jesus Christ and have had your sins forgiven and have found peace with God. It is not too late, we are living in between Zechariah 9:9 and 10, today is the day of God's grace and today is the day of salvation. Do not delay in receiving God's gift of salvation, because the day of judgment is drawing near.
