CONCLUSION:

There are some truths that you may not know, they were not fully disclosed in the Old Testament, they were there, but they needed fuller revelation from God to be fully clear. Paul then went on to reveal one of these mysteries for us. He plainly told us that the spiritual hardening of Israel was partial, it is not total because there has been a remnant of believing Jews throughout redemptive history, and it is not permanent because he tells us that this partial hardening will last until the fulness of the Gentiles has come in. Once the salvation of the Gentiles reaches completion this will bring about the events that will lead to the salvation of all Israel. Even though Israel is at enmity with God, she is still beloved by God for the sake of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. God's gracious gifts and calling are eternal. Just as the fulness of the Gentiles will begin the chain of events that will lead to the salvation of the nation of Israel, the salvation of the nation of Israel will set off a chain of events that will end in the millennial kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ.
